The WebEx videoconferencing software was used, in addition to the teleconferencing facilities, to allow forum members to view the presentations that formed part of today's forum.

1. Welcome and introductions

Richard Watkins (Chair) informed the meeting that, after today, he will be on secondment to another project for the next nine months, returning in May 2019. He will continue with his work managing the Asian hornet outbreak.

In Richard's absence, Belinda Phillipson will take over as Head of Defra Bee Health Policy. Belinda commented that she was looking forward to the role and to working with the forum and other stakeholders.

2. Asian hornet outbreak (this replaced the original item 2, to allow discussion of outbreak)

Nigel Semmence provided an update on the Asian hornet outbreak in Cornwall. Last Friday, 31^{st} August, 2 Asian hornets were caught in a monitoring trap in an apiary in Fowey. Inspections have been ongoing since then. The nest was detected on the morning of 6^{th} Sept, and destroyed the same evening

In response to a question on destruction, Nigel advised that Ficam D was used (active ingredient Bendiocarb). Genetic testing will confirm the sex of the hornets and whether they are related to a European population or represent a new incursion from China.

Ken Basterfield stated he would like to discuss the issue the issue further including views on trapping and resources available for the response. The Chair suggested this could be discussed later in the forum. He confirmed that there are sufficient inspectors to deliver the current response plan. He pointed out that over 5000 hornet alerts have been raised with NBU so far this year, through the app and by e-mail. There have been 500 alerts in this first week of September.

Nigel Semmence advised that APHA are continuing to monitor for hornets and triaging lots of other leads. Nigel appealed to forum members to encourage their membership to retain anything that they report. He noted that Asian Hornet Action Teams were also on-site in Cornwall and that APHA had contacted the University of Exeter about the possibility of using tags.

Maureen Wakefield provided an update on the Fera analysis.

Analysis of the Woolacombe (2017) and Tetbury (2016) outbreaks showed that they were unlikely to have come from the same source. They were most likely related to the French population, but were two separate incursions into the UK.

The chair noted that BBKA's Asian Hornet Week was imminent and that Defra would be willing to participate.

BBKA explained that beekeepers were keen to assist by joining AHATs. The meeting discussed ways in which these teams could have a more consistent approach.

When the nest from Fowey arrives at Fera, it will be analysed to establish the number of combs, and DNA analysis will be carried out.

3. Agenda item removed to allow for the above discussion about the Asian hornet outbreak

4. Presentation by Sam Grant, Defra statistician – Hive Count

Issues and methodologies

Submitting the number of hives determines the amount of financial aid the Government receives for apiculture work.

A baseline number of hives is obtained from the National Bee Unit at the end of August, and a second tranche of data at the beginning of March.

Quality assurance checks are carried out. Substantial changes in hive numbers are highlighted. There are also checks on beekeepers who are no longer active. Checks are done against the previous year's data.

One issue is whether there are significant numbers of beekeepers who are not part of BeeBase or registered with any beekeeper association, as these are the sources of information for the hive count.

A discussion ensued on how the hive count process might be improved.

Although the UK is shortly to leave the EU, hive count data will continue to be important, e.g. for biosecurity purposes.

The Chair thanked forum members on behalf of Defra for helping to ensure that so many more people are registered now on BeeBase – currently around 40,000.

5. <u>Presentation by Ian Fenn, Defra Nature Strategy Team - National Pollinator Strategy (NPS)</u>

The NPS is co-ordinated by Defra but is very much a partnership – many forum members are involved already.

The 10-year strategy began in 2014 following a review of the science and consultation with stakeholders, and progress was reviewed in 2016. The strategy includes training: 9,000 beekeepers have received training in disease recognition and exotic pest awareness.

Diane Stevenson explained that a Northern Ireland strategy for Bee Health and Pollinators has been drafted.

Kathleen Carroll advised that the Welsh Government action plan for pollinators was launched in 2013. Steve Sunderland added that the Scottish Government has produced an equivalent strategy.

A discussion on neonicotinoids noted that an EU-wide ban comes into effect on 19/12/18.

6. <u>Louise Mount: EU Exit and Future Farming Policy – consultation update</u>

The UK Government published a series of technical notes last month to cover a no-deal scenario. Animal health was not included in those documents, but will be covered in documents due out later in September. It will be useful for the forum to have a discussion again when this information appears.

An important question is how we will continue to trade in animals if there is no deal. A technical note has been issued regarding Customs, and work is underway to replace TRACES (Trade Control and Expert System).

Future Farming – a Bill is to be published this month and Defra will begin including this topic in discussions with stakeholders.

Consultation is ongoing regarding replacement legislation, in this case Statutory Instruments, for plant and animal health.

In most cases, legislation does not require amendment, but the 2011 regulations on Trade in Animal Related Products (TARP) will have to be replaced.

7. Any other business

There was a brief discussion about forum membership.

It was also agreed that Asian hornet would be discussed again at the next forum.
